

We've All Forgotten About THIS Type of Social Media

Tuesday evening I spent the night with a fascinating group of men. They were ham radio buffs who belong to the Lake Erie Amateur Radio Association (LEARA). I was there to introduce them to social media and the world of Web 2.0. (Truth be told, there were a few women in the room, but generally speaking, the women of

amateur radio in northeast Ohio and everywhere else are greatly outnumbered by men.)

Before I was booked for this program, my internal picture of a ham operator was of an overly devoted older man sitting in a basement with big headphones on, relaying critical information that can get out no other way and straining to hear a message that could be vital to the "war effort." Yeah..as in World Wars I and II. Now I'm ashamed to confess such a fossilized notion!

I've since that learned that as of September 2009, there are more than 800,000 licensed amateur radio operators in the U.S. They have the "amateur" label because the FCC grants a license in return for their promise not to accept compensation for their services.

And while amateur radio does indeed have an impressive history in America and other nations, it continues to play a vital role in today's communications, especially during emergencies. During the recent flooding in the Atlanta area, amateur radio, Twitter and Facebook were each credited with getting critical news updates to residents. I remember seeing a tweet earlier this year that compared the way Iranian protesters used Twitter with how ham radio serves as a reliable resource for news when more traditional media fails, or when it ignores small details that are really important to the people living through a crisis.

I think the comparison is right on the mark, so you can imagine how pleased I was to find that there's a social network just for hams: 73s.org. (73 means "best regards" in amateur radio-speak.) That site is also on Twitter (@73s). I found amateur radio podcasts, all kinds of vids on YouTube and several pages on Facebook. While the members of LEARA may be newcomers to Web 2.0, they clearly have brothers and sisters who are as comfortable

By adding the following sentence at the end of the existing Article I, Section 4:

MEETING OF THE LAKE ERIE AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION BOARD OF TRUSTEES

(26 September 2009 at the Parma-Snow Branch of the Cuyahoga County Library in Parma, Ohio)

MINUTES OF THE MEETING

Trustees Present: WB8APD, K8EHP, K2RJ, KD8ACO, N8AUC, N8NAP, N8XDO, KC8FOC, WD8JMM, WA8TJL, K8JTK, W8AZO N8OOF, N8YNR, and W2THU

Guests Present: KA8BZB, KC8UIX and KB8VBR

- 1. The meeting was called to order by WD8JMM at 0908.
- 2. It was moved and seconded that the minutes of the previous trustee's meeting were accepted after one correction. (Minute No. 6 - WD8EDS corrected to W8EDS) The motion passed unanimously.
- Treasurer's Report WB8APD reported that all submitted bills are paid and the balance in the club bank account is sufficient.
- Membership Report W8AZO reported that we have one new member since his last report and the total membership is now 218.
- Programs for 2009 KD8ACO suggested that we have a meeting on CW which is still a very popular mode. The consensus was a definite yes as it was pointed out that the R in LEARA stands for radio and not repeater. N8AUC also suggested that we invite our new ARRL Ohio Section Manager, Frank Piper. W2THU will follow up.
- 6. Technical Committee Report – K2RJ reported that he and K8SGX have been working on the new 146.76 repeater at K8QOT's site in Newbury. They have been tweaking levels, audio and the like. The repeater is actually operational at this temporary location, but the transmitter antenna is too low for good coverage. WB8APD will install a UPS at the 148.88 repeater site.
- Status of 146.76 repeater site- N8AUC reported that most of the radio equipment, antennas and cabinets were removed from Sunny Acres this past Tuesday because the building is being torn down. A small work crew spent most of the day bringing the gear down without benefit of the elevator. K8QOT supplied his trailer. WB8APD has the RLC-3. N8NAP wants the logbook to be preserved. The necessary procedures required before we can install 146.76 at its new location are well underway and Eric is hopeful that LEARA can reinstall it shortly.
- LEARA's Elmer Program KD8ACO reports that the club website attracted a potential ham who was mentored by David, resulting in his passing the Tech exam. David queried if we should give a free membership to him and others that we elmer. N8YNR so moved but

KA8BZB pointed out that the bylaws should be consulted first, specifically Article 7, section 2. N8YNR rescinded his motion. KD8ACO said that the broader question is can we do more to attract new hams? N8OOF responded that he had suggested some time ago that LEARA send 3 issues of our Newsletter to new hams. W8AZO said that he did do that with no results. WA8TJL said that we need to attract non hams by soliciting in technical journals, etc. W2THU will look into getting a list of new hams in our area from ARRL.

- 9. Need for 2nd phone line on 146.88 – WB8APD moved and K2RJ seconded that LEARA remove one of the 2 phone lines at the 146.88 site because only one line is needed for control purposes. The motion passed unanimously.
- 10. Status of the 6 meter repeater – WB8APD moved that the club should ask the membership to approve terminating the 6 meter repeater and releasing the frequency pair to the Ohio Area Repeater Council. [LEARA bylaws do not allow the Board to unilaterally shut down a repeater.] N8NAP objected because he wants to keep a 6 meter repeater on the air in this area. K2RJ disagrees because no one has been using it. W8AZO said that no one has complained since this repeater was temporarily removed from service. W2THU announced that he has reversed his longstanding policy of objecting to surrendering repeater frequencies in this instance. The motion passed 13 to 2 and must be brought to the membership.
- Cleveland Hamfest LEARA Participation -W2THU circulated a sign up sheet for the LEARA table and WD8JMM asked for further volunteers to handle the talk in station, which has been our club's traditional service to the Hamfest Association of Cleveland, which sponsors this event.



LEARA is an Affiliated Club of the ARRL. If LEARA members join or renew their ARRL membership through the club, the LEARA treasury gets to "pocket" a portion of your dues. Another neat way to support your local club!

- 12. Election Committee Report and Election SOP WD8JMM reported that two of the three members of the election committee had to resign pursuant to the Standard Operating Procedures which does not allow a person running for the Board to be on this committee. This leaves WA8TJL as the sole member of the committee. N8OOF moved and W8AZO seconded that we remove provision 3 (D)(b) from the SOP thus allowing us to send out the ballot without a membership roster. The point is to save postage since the roster is available on line. The motion passed unanimously.
- 13. Holiday Party Dinner N8XDO will contact Dimitri's Restaurant regarding the menu in due time.
- 14. 444.40 MHz Repeater Relocation Since the 444.40 repeater is now removed from Sunny Acres and the Board had already approved moving it to N8YNR's QTH, this will now be done. N8OOF offered his homebrew controller to get it back on the air.
- 15. LEARA Packer Radio Involvement W8AZO reminded us that LEARA owns the packet equipment that was at Sunny Acres (CLE1 on 145.01 MHz). He moved and N8AUC seconded that we move it to K8QOT's site. N8NAP opposed the motion which passed 14 to 1.

[Note: at 1055 N8YNR had to leave the meeting]

- 16. Website There was a spontaneous round of applause for K8JTK's excellent effort in creating the new LEARA website. WD8JMM stated that he wants to appoint a committee to promote LEARA and he appointed KC8FOC as chair. The committee will create handouts, etc
- 17. Awards for Service to the Club WD8JMM wants to hand out award certificates at the annual meeting in November. Alex said he will try to decide who will be recognized. W2THU agreed with the concept.
- 18. Bylaws N8NAP was assured that the bylaws as posted on the website are the current and official version. K2RJ said that any minutes of the membership meeting need not be further approved by the Board, but should be accepted by the Board for the record. KA8BZB said that this should be on the agenda of the annual meeting.
- 19. Meeting Minutes Archives N8NAP questioned where the minutes are archived. It was pointed out that all of the minutes are in the club secretary's possession. W2THU also pointed out that they are published in the Newsletter which can be found on the club website. They

are also archived in a computer file readily accessible by the Trustees.

- 20. 501(C)(3) Donations Received Report N8NAP questioned if we should be acknowledging donors and WD8JMM said that we can do this on a case by case basis. N8NAP said that he was thinking of the club receiving free tower space. KC8FOC said that this should be part of his new promotional committee.
- 21. New Business A) KA8BZB passed out written proposals for bylaw changes. In response, WD8JMM appointed Tom chair of the Bylaw Revision Committee. N8AUC expressed frustration with spending so much time amending the bylaws. WD8JMM, K2RJ and W2THU stated similar views.

B) WD8JMM read a letter of understanding between the Lake County Amateur Radio Association and LEARA renewing for one additional year LEARA's possession of LCARA's Advanced Computer Control RC 850 controller. The letter has been signed by the presidents of the respective clubs. WD8JMM told us that LCARA does not want to sell the controller to LEARA at this time.

C) KD8ACO said that the LEARA net, which operated on 146.88 this past Thursday, set a new milestone in that 8 trustees checked in. W2THU stated that there were 24 check-ins, including a VA3 and that the first round had 10 check-ins.

22. Motion to Adjourn – K2RJ moved and W8AZO seconded the motion to adjourn at 1140. The motion passed unanimously.
