Letter From the Editor

As LEARA ends its 40th year as an organized Amateur Radio Club, we need to look back over how the hobby has changed in that time as well as look forward to what we want the club to be in the future.

There is no doubt that LEARA was originally organized around repeaters when repeaters were the newest "craze" in our hobby. With repeaters, local and mobile communications became easier and more commonplace. We could now more easily support public service events such as walk-a-thons, triathlons, marathons and other local activities. Later, low-cost handheld transceivers made these activities even easier to support. Autopatches not only gave us a way to "call home" from the road but also facilitated our interface with police, fire and EMS forces, and later the 911 centers, to report incidents we came across in our travels. LEARA (and other local repeaters) were full of "chatter" from early morning to late at night.

Fast-forward 20 years.... The repeaters are much quieter. The autopatch has been made obsolete by the ubiquitous cellphone. Some groups we used to support with our services now use "direct connect" or "push-to-talk" services provided with their cellphone. We (as well as many public safety entities) have to "sell" our "point-to-multipoint" (where all parties can hear the transmissions) capabilities of conventional radio repeater systems.

Can LEARA survive these changes and the others that are inevitable? What do we want our club to be as it continues to age? How can we get more younger persons involved in Amateur Radio and the club? All of these questions are basic survival questions that need to be answered by each and every club member. LEARA over the past 20 years has broadened its scope from repeaters to more general Ham Radio interests. I believe we must continue to find ways of doing this and our meeting programs of late have reflected this change. Ham Radio isn't just "talking on the radio" any more. We must be more into thinking "outside the box" to provide integrated contingency communications services. This is our challenge! -AR-

LEARA Annual Meeting Report October 27, 2009

The following bylaw amendment proposed by Tom Kimball, KA8BZB, at our September meeting passed unanimously at the Annual Meeting:

MOTION: To Amend the LEARA Bylaws as follows:

By deleting, in its entirety, Article VII Section 2 which reads:

"Section 2. Suspension of the Bylaws on dues (Article I, Section 4) and election of members (Article I, Section 2) at any meeting shall require unanimous consent of the active members present."

By adding the following sentence at the end of the existing Article I, Section 4:

This dues requirement may be waived by action of the Board of Trustees or the membership at any meeting thereof.

Trustee ballots were accepted per the bylaws counted per our SOP. Results are posted on page 1 of this issue. On motion of a member, seconded and passed unanimously, the ballots were ordered destroyed. -AR-

76 Repeater Update

The repeater is still undergoing final modifications and adjustments from its temporary site in the Newbury area. It is transmitting at a power level of 175 watts and the duplexer has been installed so that the local receiver is operable with decent sensitivity. Coverage is improved with the relocation of the antenna higher on the tower and most of the voting receivers are being received at that location. The main job remaining is getting the audio levels and equalization adjusted so that the system "sounds" good.

We are still awaiting the final approval to move the repeater to the tower site that has been promised very near to the old hospital site. These things take time, however, so the repeater may be operating from its temporary quarters for some time to come.



MEETING OF THE LAKE ERIE AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION BOARD OF TRUSTEES

(7 November 2009 at the Parma-Snow Branch of the Cuyahoga County Library in Parma, Ohio)

MINUTES OF THE MEETING**MINUTES OF THE MEETING**

Trustees present: K2RJ, WB8APD, N8XDO, W8AZO, KD8ACO, KC8FOC, N8NAP, WA8TJL, N8AUC, N8OOF, N8YNR, W2THU, WD8JMM. Trustees excused: K8JTK and K8EHP.

Guests: KC8UIX, W8DMT

1. The meeting was called to order at 0903.
2. The Trustees conducted an election of officers by secret ballot. The new officers, selected by majority vote or acclimation are: President: WD8JMM, Vice-Presidents: KD8ACO and N8AUC, Secretary: W2THU, Treasurer: WB8APD, License Trustee: N8AUC, Radio Officers: N8OOF and K2RJ.
3. The minutes of the previous meeting was accepted after making the following corrections: Minute No. 6: change 148.88 to 146.88; Minute No. 8: change "David queried" to "Alex queried" in the second sentence. Minute No. 15: change "LEARA Packer Radio" to "LEARA Packet Radio."
4. Treasurer's Report - WB8APD reported on the money in the bank and funds to be deposited shortly. The club is in good financial footing at this time.
5. Membership Report - W8AZO reported that we have 221 paid up members. 123 are paid up through the end of 2010.
6. Programs for 2010 – W8TAB reported via telephone that the January program is W8KFJ on Software Defined Radios, February is a program on Morse Code and March is tentatively Skywarn but this might not happen this year because Gary Garnet from NWS is considering a countywide program for 2010.
7. Technical Committee Report – N8YNR reported that he was not sure when he would be able to install the 440.40 repeater at his QTH. He still needs to obtain a controller and suitable antenna. WD8JMM expressed his concern that the only way to control the 444.70 repeater is over the air since the phone line has been removed.
8. Status of 146.76 repeater – K2RJ reported that the duplexer and isolator are installed at the temporary site in Newbury. K8SGX is working on equalizing the audio levels from the remote inputs. N8AUC reported that the

site survey at the new location has not yet been completed, so that we don't have final permission or an installation date. The new repeater will not have autopatch and the need for a courtesy tone is still up for discussion.

9. Holiday Party Dinner – N8XDO reported that the menu and the cost to the members will be the same as last year. The Board unanimously approved door prizes as follows: First is a \$100.00 gift card. Second and Third are \$50.00 gift cards. Any tie will be resolved by a sudden death playoff so there is only one winner per prize.

10. Online Membership and Electronic Balloting – N8YNR stated that he hoped to have a demonstration of electronic voting at the next Trustee's meeting. He also wants to enable Paypal as an additional method for the club to collect dues. N8AUC stated that he doesn't want to give up the \$1.10 fee for a Paypal renewal. N8XDO said that this is better than not getting a renewal from a member who doesn't want to write a check. N8OOF stated that he would like to see LEARA send out renewal notices via email several times before we send a written request to a member. WD8JMM said that he will have a proposal for electronic voting by the next meeting and WB8APD said that he would do the same for electronic voting.

11. Sale of RLC-3 and other items – N8NAP reported that he saw an RLC-3 for sale on the internet for \$1300. Collective memory was that the club paid about \$3,000.00 for the controller with the additional boards. N8OOF said that we should be sure that we will not be setting up a multi repeater site again where we would need the RLC-3 before we decide to sell it. The consensus was to see how much we can get for it.

12. Need to amend bylaws to clarify that Trustees Emeriti do not pay dues? – N8NAP was assured that the status of Trustee Emeritus implies lifetime membership with no dues requirement. In any event, the bylaw committee can look into this matter if necessary.

13. New Business – WA8TJL reported that he is ready to teach the entry level Technician class in January, but was concerned over the poor attendance last year. There was a discussion as to the best way to promote LEARA classes. N8YNR suggested publicizing in the area newspapers. KD8ACO reminded us that we are trying to attract young people into the hobby and they don't necessarily get their news from the print medium. He said we need to publicize our classes at schools and libraries. N8OOF suggested that we prepare a ham radio exhibit for library display cases. W8AZO told him to contact Dee Logan, W1HEO, of the Ham Radio Promotion Project.

N8NAP moved that the club give a free membership to anyone who takes our classes and passes the FCC exam. The motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

W2RCA Special Event Station



Beginning at 9 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 21, and lasting until 4 p.m., panelists participating in the six sessions will discuss everything from amateur radio education in the classroom to what's happening with mesh networks.


