

LEARA members will receive an email with a link to click on to join the meeting. Members will have a choice between using an online app or an app downloaded and installed onto their computer, tablet, or cell phone. It is recommended for the best experience to download and install the app in advance of the meeting day. The app is free and available at https://www.webex.com/downloads.html/

Once You Have the App Installed, you'll be able to go to test your set up at https://www.webex.com/test-meeting. On the evening of the meeting, Tuesday April 28th, at about 6:30 PM we will have the meeting live for people to check into and verify their set up is working. **Jeff Garvas, N8YNR**, will be available by 7:00 PM to help those who may need it. If all else fails, you may contact **Jeff** at, **216-496-3928 (cell or text)**. The meeting will start at 7:30 PM.

Once the meeting starts, you will have a button to click on to raise your hand. Those who wish to comment or ask a question will click the button. When you are recognized by the moderator your microphone will be turned on and you will be able to ask your question. We've used the WebEx system for Trustees' meetings and small-scale testing. Once participants have their camera, microphone, and speakers, sorted out it works very well. If you have a headset or separate microphone it is recommended that you use it.

Feeling Trapped! Hustler 5-BTV

We all well know that the Corona Virus of 2020 has certainly altered our lives, our finances, our health, our social postures, our work schedules and perhaps even our hobby time. Hopefully, our portfolios remain optimistically healthy, our personal health remains unaffected and that we are finding more time for amateur radio. I am and I'll share a recent story.

The story begins now three years ago at the Dayton Hamvention (the first in Xenia) when, among other goodies, I bought a New-Tronics Hustler 5-BTV. This antenna was intended to replace a Cushcraft R-7 that had ultimately succumbed to long-term ultraviolet damage and water entry to the balun box (that final kilowatt use must have created quite the light show...arc!). The R-7 was a bit gangly and really cried out for guying...which I never did. That's the back story.

Now to the 5-BTV. As most of you know, this is a 5 band (10, 15, 20, 40 and 80) meter trapped vertical that can be ground mounted or elevated. I chose ground mounting on a five foot (3' in the ground and 2' above grade) 2" galvanized pipe (top capped). The antenna is mounted on the side of our home just in front of a conifer tree (not ideal) as revealed in the picture but was the only

"approved" location. Parenthetically, mounting the antenna alongside of - or in close proximity - to our home would be less than ideal because that house elevation is aluminum sided. Supplementing the antenna is a DX Engineering radial plate at the bae of the mounting pipe (mast) and a DX Engineering tilt-over mount that facilitates assembly and tuning. This location limits uniform radial distribution so I have about forty various length radials that are largely deployed in two polar directions (north and south). See the picture. And, after returning from the 2017 Hamvention, I quickly installed the mounting pipe, radials and feed line.



Following the instructions (of so I thought) I tuned the antenna using a tape measure, wrench and an MFJ-259 antenna analyzer. Of course, we know that real men and real "hams" don't really read the instructions. The message here is to read and fully understand the instructions. Let me explain. The traps used on this antenna are LC traps with the "L' portion supplied by wound coils (for 10, 15 and 20 meters). The 80 meter coil is an add-on coil installed at the antenna top. The "C" portion is accomplished with the surrounding (and protective) cans that are hose clamped at the trap base and that slip into PVC caps that insulate and seal against water entry, the upper portion of the trap. If one were to actually read the instructions the reader would be cautioned in bold print to not adjust the clamp at the trap base when tuning the antenna.

Unfettered by instructions, I proceeded to "tune" my antenna by adjusting any and all of the clamps to achieve the best VSWR readings that

I could attain. By this time, you likely suspect that I really didn't achieve satisfactory VSWR values or antenna performance. Two years passed and here we are struggling with the Virus. So what was Fred to do?

First, I visited the New-Tronics website and secured the latest version of the instructions (which, to my dismay and private but now public embarrassment, remained unchanged). Now, using the Rig Expert AA-230 Zoom analyzer and



my "new" instructions, I proceeded with emboldened vigor to tune the antenna but with disappointing results. What to do? Go directly to the source I reasoned. My call to New-Tronics was delightfully greeted by Candie who then directly connected me with their technician, Mike. Mike, it turns out, is both a very patient and valued resource who explained how to tune the traps and of course, the larger antenna. By the way, for those hams who actually read instructions, the New-Tronics website also has a page explaining the trap tuning procedure (which, when read with care) is really helpful).

Cutting to the chase as they say, tuning the traps is really the key to antenna performance as you would imagine. Tuning the traps is not a, pardon the pun, a "ham-handed" effort. The LC trap relationship is very delicate and adjustment of the trap cans requires very small (almost infinitesimal) movements of the trap clamp and can. The process starts with the 10 meter trap, proceeding to the 15 meter trap and then the 20 meter trap. Proper tuning of each successive trap is critical to overall antenna performance. The 80 meter trap is really adjusted by cutting the top end whip to the desired frequency (I like 3885 for AM operation).

Having just completed finessing the antenna traps, I am absolutely delighted with the VSWR curves, I am hearing band activity that I suspect I could not have previously heard and this may well be my go to antenna for 15 meters. Of course, the "on the air" performance will be the final and best test of performance. However, the reports of this antennas performance will have to wait for another Newsletter or our next Chapter meeting. Meanwhile, anyone of you with a Hustler 4-BTV, 5-BTV or 6-BTCw ho doesn't care to read the instructions and would like some "experienced' help in tuning your Hustler antenna, I stand at the ready to help. Stay safe and enjoy your family and amateur radio. Best

Bylaw Updates

ATTENTION all LEARA members:

At the last Board meeting (March), the undersigned was directed to make the following modifications to the appropriate LEARA Bylaws and SOP:

Bylaws:

ARTICLE III - ELECTION OF TRUSTEES & VACANCIES

Section 1. The President shall, not later than the April meeting of members each year date/time specified in the most current SOP, appoint both a Nomination and Election Committee. The Nomination Committee shall be responsible for receiving, processing, and/or making nomina-tions, and seeking out

qualified candidates for Trustee and persuading them to accept nomi-nation. All incumbent Trustees shall be automa-tically nominated when their terms expire unless they withdraw their names. To be eligible for nomination, an individual shall have paid dues in accordance with Article I for the 12 months immediately preceding his or her nomination. A candidate for Trustee may be nominated by two or more members in good standing. Nominations shall be in writing or electronic email, and shall be delivered to the Nomination Committee not later than the regular August meeting of members, together with a statement by the candidate that he or she will serve as Trustee if elected. The Nomination Committee shall publish a list of

nominees not later than the regular September meeting of members.

Elections SOP:

1. Election Committee:

A. Committee Chairperson: Not later than the April Membership May Trustees' meeting, the President shall (according to the bylaws) appoint an Election Committee Chairperson.

The reason for the change is to allow appropriate latitude to the Board for the appointment of the nominating/election committee(s). In the past, it has become necessary to extend the date each year. Modern technology no longer requires such long lead time.

This action will be carried out in accor-dance with current procedures. The SOP only needs approval by the Board (already done). The Bylaws change needs membership approvals; this message serve as a reading of the proposal. The election will take place at the next membership meeting, which may be done by mail.

Anyone having comment about this should contact a Board member to allow proper handling.

The Medical Net, a special COVID-19 net, is running Wednesdays, 0130 UTC, on 7.222 MHz. The net deals with correct data on COVID-19 epidemiology care, care issues, and more. Net control will be Dr. Harry Przekop, WB9EDP, a past president of the Medical Amateur Radio Council Organization (MARCO) and now a director at large.

Przekop is a specialist in infectious diseases and biomedical physics and is board-certified as an expert in HIV care.

Participants do not need to be physicians or medical providers to check in, ask questions, and otherwise take part, but no diagnoses can be rendered. The regular MARCO Grand Rounds Net is held on Sundays, 1500 UTC, on 14.342 MHz.
