Automatic Packet Reporting System (APRS) is an amateur radio-based system for real time digital communications of information of immediate value in the local area. Data can include object Global Positioning System (GPS) coordinates, weather station telemetry, text messages, announcements, queries, and other telemetry. APRS data can be displayed on a map, which can show stations, objects, tracks of moving objects, weather stations, search and rescue data, and direction finding data.

LEARA switching to Zoom. As I mentioned in last month's column and during the meeting, WebEx is imposing additional limitations on the length of meetings within their free service. The coronavirus/COVID-19 and Restaurant Meetings: Our venue chair, Eddie Stevens, has had no success in finding a restaurant willing to schedule group meetings through the end of 2020. They are concerned about entering into a contract that they may not be able to fulfill.

On a related note, a close friend and his family have contracted the virus. Of the three, he seems to have it the worst but is getting by at home. They know exactly when and where they became infected as there was only one place where they could have come in contact with it in the last several weeks. And, it was the only place they have been without wearing a mask. So, one lapse has led to this situation.

Folks, I beg you to get a good quality mask and wear it whenever you are in public. Wear it so that it covers your mouth and nose. If it has a metal nose piece, bend it for a proper fit. Put it on AND leave it on. There is no reason to remove it to speak. Any mask is better than no mask, but quality made-in-USA N95 masks are available for about \$12 each in packs of five. KN95 is an Asian standard that has essentially the same level of filtration but is somewhat more restrictive in air flow so they can be a bit harder to breathe through. KN95 masks can be found online for about \$3 each in packs of ten. The masks can be sanitized with isopropyl (rubbing) alcohol, left to air dry, and reused. 70% alcohol will kill viruses and bacteria in about 20 to 30 seconds while 90% and higher will do the job in one to three seconds.

Allstar coming to 146.88!

Over the next several weeks, changes will be coming to 146.88. We are installing AllstarLink on the repeater.

You can visit https://allstarlink.org for general information, but it's a method of linking repeaters and simplex nodes together. You can even build your own simplex node and link it in. You can link our repeater to any other Allstar node-like IRLP. This will give us Echolink, and we now have an official Broadcastify feed for 88 so you can listen on your favorite smart phone app or web browser. Over the next several weeks,

you may hear funny noises, tones, and other weirdness on the repeater as I install and test things. I will put together more details and specific instructions for use after everything is set up and fully tested.

Balloon Launched by Popular Web Show Host Completes Second Round Trip

A balloon launched on May 20 by "Amateur Radio Roundtable" web show host Tom Medlin, W5KUB, and team has begun its third circumnavigation of Earth. The balloon, at 43,000 – 45,000 feet, completed its second trip around the globe on June 19. It crossed the Atlantic ocean "in record time" at a speed of about 170 MPH, the balloon website reported this week.

The balloon, identified as W5KUB-18, carries APRS and WSPR amateur radio payloads. As of the afternoon of June 23, it was heading over Uzbekistan at more than 100 MPH.

As the balloon website states, the mission and goal are to launch a high-altitude balloon for long-duration and multiple trips around the world. The balloon, an SBS-13, is capable of flying up to 45,000 feet. "It will be filled with hydrogen to obtain higher altitude," the website explains.

"It will be solar powered only (no batteries, so it will only transmit during daylight). We will receive tracking every 10 minutes via WSPR on HF [14.0971 MHz]." Tracking transmissions will be turned off over the UK, Yemen, and North Korea due to regulations. The homebrew tracking transmitter runs just 10 mW but, Medlin told ARRL, it's being heard as far away as 9,000 miles.
