Transmitter hunting (also known as T-hunting, fox hunting, bunny hunting, and bunny chasing), is an activity wherein participants use radio direction finding techniques to locate one or more radio transmitters hidden within a designated search area. Transmitter hunting is pursued in several different popular formats. Many transmitter hunts are organized by local radio clubs, and may be conducted in conjunction with other events, such as a radio enthusiast convention or club meeting. Before each hunt, participants are informed of the frequency or frequencies on which the transmitters will be operating, and a set of boundaries that define a search area in which the transmitters will be located. Transmitter hunters use radio direction finding techniques to determine the likely direction and distance to the hidden transmitter from several different locations, and then triangulate the probable location of the transmitter.



and clean alternative for home backup power or power while camping. Jeff explained how he started with gasoline generators but moved to **lithium powered generator/inverters**. The inverter Jeff uses is available at Lowe's under the EGO brand. These use rechargeable lithium batteries to provide 120 VAC. One of the big features of this unit is that it uses multiple hotswappable batteries. Jeff has 12 batteries that he also uses to power his lawn mower, edger, and snow blower, which means he well positioned for providing back up power. Besides charging from the mains power, in a pinch Jeff can recharge the batteries from his car.

He uses a manual transfer switch to get the power into his house wiring to be able keep his family comfortable in the event of mains power outage. During a three-day outage he was able to provide power for his furnace, microwave, coffee pot, lighting, and yes, even his ham radios. Jeff has also used this system for power on camping trips.

The March Meeting will include a presentation by yours truly on Fox hunting for new Hams or beginning Fox hunters. While I'm going to start very basic, I will also share some hints and tips from 20+ years of experience in foxhunting. I will include a smattering of information from several areas, but I'm going to focus mostly on getting started with minimal cost and effort while getting the greatest results.

Please share the meeting info on any nets you might be on, with other Ham Radio clubs, and with anyone who you think might be interested in this presentation. # 146.760 Repeater Maintenance Update

On March 26th, I will shut down the .76 repeater for a period of several weeks. Bill Hess and I have spent countless hours at the site over the past few years trying to resolve various issues, mostly relating to the quality of the audio and a persistent hum on the signal. There are also issues with link receivers. On Sunday, we found a leaking capacitor in one of the voter cards which we promptly replaced with a spare. It seems like every time we fix something, a new problem crops up.

Therefore, I intend to tear down and rebuild .76 - using existing parts where possible; I'm not opposed to replacing aged-out parts with newer ones, but we need to be smart about it. This will allow me to go over every individual component with a fine-toothed comb, get everything fully tested, and give me a chance to re-do the wiring which has become a bit of a mess.

I appreciate your continued patience while we get this done. I'll provide updates as time allows. For now, please use the .88 repeater, which should be back on the air by the time you read this.

# ARISS Ham Station Is Once Again Operational

Some 6 weeks after going silent following a spacewalk that installed new antenna cabling, the Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) ham station in the Columbus module is once again operational. The Columbus station, which typically uses the call sign NA1SS, is the primary ARISS amateur radio station used for school contacts and other activities. A January 27 spacewalk replaced a coax feed line installed 11 years ago with another built by the European Space Agency (ESA) and Airbus.

While the specific cause of the problem has not yet been determined, a March 13 spacewalk that restored the antenna cabling to its original configuration provided the cure. The plan to return the ARISS cabling to its original configuration had been a "contingency task" for a March 5 spacewalk, but the astronauts ran out of time. The ARISS work was appended to the todo list for astronauts Mike Hopkins, KF5LJG, and Victor Glover, KI5BKC, to complete a week later.

"On behalf of the ARISS International Team, our

heartfelt thanks to all who helped ARISS work through the cable anomaly investigation, troubleshooting, and ultimate repair," ARISS International Chair Frank Bauer, KA3HDO, said. Bauer praised NASA, the ESA, Airbus, and ARISS-Russia lead Sergey Samburov, RV3DR. While the Columbus ham station was off the air, ARISS school and group contacts were able to continue using the ham station in the ISS Service Module on the Russian side of the station.

During the weekend spacewalk, Hopkins swapped out a cable for the Bartolomeo commercial payload-handling platform that had been installed in series with the ARISS VHF-UHF antenna feed line, returning the ARISS system to its pre-January 27 configuration. Hopkins raised a question concerning a sharp bend in the cable near a connector, but no further adjustments were possible.

On March 14, ARISS was able to confirm the operation's success when Automatic Packet Reporting System (APRS) signals on 145.825 MHz were heard in California, Utah, and Idaho as the ISS passed overhead. ARISS team member Christy Hunter, KB6LTY, was able to digipeat through NA1SS during the pass. With additional confirmation from stations in South America and the Middle East, ARISS declared the radio system operational again.
