

variety of apps and products available for viewing weather radar on your cell phone, tablet, or computer. Some of the apps are available for free while others may cost a few dollars to enable all of their features. These apps allow real time viewing of weather radar images from anywhere in the world. It is possible to view a variety of aspects of the radar showing wind direction and intensity, rain, snow, etc. and parsed for different altitudes and angles of elevation. It was fascinating to see the amount of information available at one's fingertips.

The May Meeting will feature a presentation by **Eric Jessen**, **N8AUC**, with the topic being **NVIS Antennas**. Per Eric, "I've had a number of folks ask me how I can check in to the Ohio Statewide ARES net on 3.902 MHz and hear W8SGT at 20 over 9, and consistently get S9+ reports from them, when others can't even hear W8SGT. 



Public Service Events

Mat Nickoson KC8NZJ Event Support Group Founder

Public Service Season is officially in full swing! With our support of the Run The Land Marathon on April 9, and the Cleveland Marathon on May 21 and 22, we are already well under way. Looking forward to the month of May and early June, there is lots to get involved in.

The early part of May kicked off with Lake County ARES supporting the 10 Mile Drop. A 10mile down-hill run from Chardon to Concord. In Cuyahoga we are supporting the Woof Walk on Saturday, May 14th. This is a 5k walk to support the Northeast SPCA, a no kill animal shelter. Participants are invited to bring their 4-legged friends. The walk is being marshalled by Kelly Dobeck KD8TWX from WOIO 19 News. Later in May (after the Cleveland Marathon of course) is the Blossom Time Run in Chagrin Falls on Sunday, May 29th. Support for this is being led up by the Geauga Emergency Amateur Radio Service (GEARS). The run is a 5.25-mile route beginning and ending in Downtown Chagrin Falls.

June events will then kick off with the Hill Yeah Half Marathon in Lake County on June 5th supported by Lake County ARES, and then the Sunday in June (SIJ) bike ride starting and ending in Burton, Ohio on June 12th supported by Matt Welch W8DEC. SIJ consists of multiple routes covering 25, 40, 65, and 100 miles of beautiful Geauga County.

These events will give amateurs the opportunity to do things like staff water stops, drive SAG (Support and Gear) vehicles, shadow event officials, and in the case of Blossom Time, help law enforcement officials block roadways. But most importantly, helping with these events is good practice for us to learn how to communicate more effectively, and operate outside of our homes. These skills could even come in handy in the event of an emergency. ARES® Activated in Oklahoma for Tornado Clean-Up Communications

To help with emergency communications support following an outbreak of tornadoes that hit this past week, the Oklahoma Department of Emergency of Management and Homeland Security requested support from the Oklahoma Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®).

During the first week of May, 12 tornadoes touched down in the central and eastern parts of Oklahoma. The tornado that struck Seminole, Oklahoma, on Wednesday, May 4, left EF2 damage, according to the National Weather Service. That tornado was a mile wide, and its path totaled 31 miles.

The request for amateur radio emergency communications support from the Oklahoma ARES was made on Thursday, May 5, 2022. ARES was activated on Saturday May 7, 2022. Seven amateur radio operators were active, providing voice communications between chainsaw and debris removal teams from their base at Seminole

State College's volunteer center.

ARRL Oklahoma Section Emergency Coordinator Mark Conklin, N7XYO, said the clean-up crews worked quickly, and ARES was needed for 8 hours until cellular and wired communications were restored.

There were no deaths or injuries during the tornado outbreak, but clean up continues.
