

Nonetheless, 21 members did come out to socialize and see the program presented by Eric Jessen, N8AUC, showing off his "new and improved" portable solar power setup for Ham Radio. Even though I've seen the program before, I was still impressed with the improvements. The latest solar panels are thinner, smaller, and lighter, around 20 lbs. if my memory is correct. The battery box using a lithium iron phosphate battery (LiFePO) is half the weight of a lead acid battery while providing twice the usable power. Eric also has a special meter that tracks power going into and out of the battery so he always knows how much he has available.

Since we had extra meals that were paid for, we held a drawing to distribute them. Four lucky members got to take home a spare meal.

NOAA Announcement

The NWS Wilmington, OH weather radar will be undergoing maintenance starting on October 21 as part of a Service Life Extension Program (SLEP) to extend the life of the WSR-88D radars across the country.

This maintenance will result in the Wilmington, OH radar being down for seven days.

During the downtime, adjacent radars that can be accessed include:

Fort Wayne/Northern Indiana; Indianapolis, IN; Louisville, KY; Jackson, KY; Charleston, WV; Pittsburgh, PA and Cleveland, OH as well as FAA TDWRs near Cincinnati, OH; Dayton, OH and Columbus, OH.

Have you ever wanted to try out the 125cm band? LEARA has a high profile repeater there, in Lakewood.

My experience is about what one might expect; the propagation there is a blend of 2m and 70cm, which makes it a powerful communications band.

My experience is that the 224.900 machine has about a dozen occasional users, but it's quiet as a tomb more often than not. I have a solution.

With the coming of inexpensive Chinese Amateur Radio gear, hams can get on 125cm for about 50 USD. A triband HT AND an aftermarket triband antenna can be had from Amazon for that \$50.

Florida Amateur Radio Operators Activate for Hurricane Ian

As Hurricane Ian was making its way to Tampa, Florida, in late September, the Sheriff's Tactical Amateur Radio Communications (STARC), W4HSO, was preparing for activation. ARRL member Tony DeAngelo, N2MFT, said STARC was activated on Monday, September 26, and continued operations through Thursday, September 29, 2022.

STARC has amateur radio equipment in five of the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) locations, as well as a Homeland Security office. "It's a great working arrangement with all of the equipment provided for us," said DeAngelo. "Our volunteers staffed those locations and the remainder worked from their homes."

Over the course of the 4-day activation, 16 STARC volunteers worked 24 hours a day passing information for aid and assistance through the sheriff's office using WebEOC, a

web-based emergency management information system.

DeAngelo emphasized that STARC is not a club, but a service organization. STARC volunteers are required to undergo an extensive background investigation, including fingerprinting by the HCSO. STARC volunteers are civilians and employees of various Hillsborough County government agencies, Verizon, Tampa Electric, St. Joseph's Hospital, Tampa Police Department, and other public and private agencies. In the event of a disaster, radio operators provide communications between participating agencies if normal means of communications are lost.

DeAngelo is a retired police officer, and has been a licensed amateur radio operator for 30 years. He will continue to monitor weather information in case another activation is needed.
