The ARRL election for the position of **ARRL Great Lakes Division Director** closed November 17, 2023. The current ARRL Vice Director **Scott Yonally, N8SY**, won the election with 2,175 votes. **Michael Kalter, W8CI** received 2,023 votes for the position. Scott will assume his new role beginning January 1, 2024.

ARRL Dues and Magazines Changes: Last month I reported that starting January 1, 2024, the annual dues will increase from \$49 to \$59 per year. Further, ARRL members who want to receive a printed copy of the magazine must pay an additional \$25 per year. Digital issues of all four magazines will be available to all members. If you are an ARRL member, you should have received a post card informing you of the change and explaining your options.

Nominations / Elections: Despite the diligent efforts of the Nominating Committee and the other Trustees, we were unable to find

candidates willing to run for Trustee. Therefore, all incumbent Trustees (Eric Jessen, N8AUC; Eddie Stevens, KD8FTS; and Jon Anhold, KM8V) were retained. At the November Trustees' Meeting all officers were reappointed to their previous positions.

Elections #2: While not everything on the ballot November 7 went the way I would have liked, the tax renewal and slight increase for the benefit of Cuyahoga Community College passed by a substantial margin. Thank you to all those who voted for it.

NOARS Last Foxhunt of 2023 was held Saturday, October 28 as an on-foot at South Central Park in North Ridgeville. Twenty-one people attended from at least four counties, some as far away as Huron County. Plans are being made to have in-car foxhunts starting in the spring covering much larger areas. In-car hunts introduce a whole new set of challenges. One can compete successfully with the same equipment used for on-foot hunts or use much more sophisticated gear including computer mapping. It's a lot of fun.

Until January, talk on the radio and use the repeaters. Check into one of the many nets available on the LEARA repeaters. Join us on the air, online, or in person. If you don't feel safe meeting in person, we understand. But, we really want to see or at least hear from you, even if it is only by radio or Zoom.

Holiday Project Idea: HAMClock selfbuild

This recent <u>YouTube</u> <u>video</u> features an introduction to the HAMClock program, which is a free and easy-to-use tool for ham radio operators. The program can be downloaded and used on Raspberry Pi or Linux systems, as well as Windows computers. The speaker showcases the various features of the program, including showing live PSK spots, displaying DX clusters, and providing weather information. HAMClock is considered an excellent substitute for a geocon and is a valuable resource for efficient logging
