

bingo we had three drawings for LEARA dinner bucks and the two Main prizes of a **Yaesu FT-65R HT** and the Red Mystery HT, a Baofeng UV-S9 HT.

The Yaesu included a Nifty Accessories Quick Reference Card to make getting started easier. Besides coming in a red case, the **Baofeng** is an 8-watt (rated) radio and included an extended antenna (similar to a Nagoya NA-771), a drop-in charger, a USB charger, and an earpiece.

LED lightbulb RFI: We have all heard of LED lightbulbs creating radio frequency interference, particularly in the HF bands. Well, a while ago I encountered a different sort of interaction between an LED lightbulb and radio frequency. I was finishing up a QSO on a local UHF repeater as I backed my minivan into the garage.

On the ceiling of the garage is a light fixture with a standard screw-in LED light bulb. I noticed that every time I transmitted on UHF, the light would go out. As soon as I unkeyed, the light

ARRL Responds to FCC Proposals

ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® responded to the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) request for comments on removing the symbol (baud) rate restrictions that apply to data communications on the LF bands and the VHF and UHF bands below 450 MHz. The FCC also requested comments on the bandwidth limits applicable to those bands.

The FCC's action follows their 2023 decision to remove the symbol (baud) rate limits on the 160-to 10-meter amateur bands. Those limits were replaced with a 2.8 kHz bandwidth limit, a move ARRL had long advocated for.

The FCC's Further Notice of Proposed R ulemaking sought comments on updating the other amateur bands on which its symbol (baud) rate limits continue to throttle faster data rates. The subject bands are the LF bands (2200 and 630 meters) and the VHF and UHF bands below 450 MHz. In its comments, ARRL strongly agreed with the FCC's proposal to remove the symbol (baud) rate limits on the remaining bands.

ARRL's comments also noted that CW operation is protected in the lower 100 kHz of the 6- and 2-meter bands and will continue to be so protected, but otherwise, all modes are permitted in the remainder of the subject VHF and UHF bands with only the data modes subject to bandwidth restrictions below 450 MHz that vary by band. The bandwidth restrictions uniquely applicable to data modes have resulted in the other modes being permitted to use many times the bandwidth of data modes in an intermixed fashion determined by those using the bands. For the data modes, however, the limits have limited experimentation with techniques already in use in other countries on amateur VHF and UHF bands.
